Work try-outs

Starting a business whilst unemployed



As a job seeker, you can get unemployment benefit for four months even if you start a business. Receiving the benefit requires that the business was started whilst you were unemployed. Start-up grant

The start-up grant is a TE service that provides financial support for new entrepreneurs aiming to engage in full-time entrepreneurship. Applications for start-up grant can be submitted by unemployed people, people planning to leave paid employment to start a business, or students, for example. All company types and industries are eligible.

Conditions for a start-up grant

- ✓ The future business activities are, by nature, full-time and permanent.
- ✓ The applicant has sufficient skills, training and work experience in the field.
- ✓ Sufficient capabilities for becoming an entrepreneur: experience or suitable training for entrepreneurship.
- ✓ The business plan and the calculations are ready, and they have been estimated to be profitable (by the nearest Enterprise Agency, for instance)
- ✓ Financing, business premises, permits and the equivalent are already known; the applicant must have all of the prerequisites for setting up a company and launching business operations.

The Start-up grant will not be granted if

- ✗ The applicant's full-time entrepreneurship has started before the decision on the start-up grant has been made.

A business is considered to have started when the following activities have begun; production, sales, marketing (including publishing a website), or the business is registered for VAT, preliminary tax, or is in the employers register. Securing business premises or conducting market research are not considered as starting activities.

If you intend to expand your previous part-time business into a full-time entrepreneurial activity, the start-up grant must be applied for and a decision must be made on it before the activity becomes full-time.

- ✗ The entrepreneurship provides a reasonable livelihood straight away. The financial risks are very low.
- ✗ You have other income, incl. salary, student allowance, parental allowance, pensions.
- ✗ Non-trivial tax debts or payment defaults. We will check your credit history.



Duration and amounts for 2020

Start-up grants are awarded for 6 months at a time, usually in 1-2 periods. The grant amount is:

€33,66 per day, or about **€700 per month**

A start-up grant is personal, taxable income that is paid for maximum 5 days per week.

When you apply for a start-up grant

1. Don't register your business yet.
Create your *own workspace* in the My Enterprise Finland online service oma.yrityssuomi.fi. Get help by phone, Tel: **0295 020 502**. 
2. Draw up a preliminary business plan (LTS) and profitability calculations in My Enterprise Finland.
3. Book an appointment for personal business advice at the nearest Enterprise Agency, see previous page. 
4. Finalise your business plan and acquire other attachments for your application.
 - Order your tax debt certificate www.vero.fi/verovelkatodistus and
 - if necessary, request a *promise for a loan* for financing needs.
 - Negotiate a (*pre*) contract for business premises.
 - Update your CV 
5. If necessary, ask for more information from the TE office starttiraha.uusimaa@te-toimisto.fi
6. Submit your **start-up grant application electronically, with attachments** at the TE Services website at www.te-palvelut.fi → E-Services.
7. You will receive a decision approximately two weeks after submitting the application and all of the requested enclosures.
8. After starting a business, you can apply to take part in a free coaching service [Start Up Plus 2.0](#) to improve your sales and marketing skills.
